You earned a diploma: Now what?

Graduate school? Rent or buy a house? What about health insurance?

When Gale Bowman, 26, graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 2005, she began pondering those questions.

"Right out of college, there were a lot of things I struggled with. The first was how to even survive in the working environment, since it's so different from college, and then there's the whole question about career

development," said Bowman, a Mooresville native who lives in Chicago and works as a hotel analyst for Orbitz.com.

"When I went on the Internet, there was lots of information, but it wasn't in any one place."

So Bowman, using her marketing degree and post-graduate experience, recently launched www.WhatCollegeForgot.com, a Web site that helps young professionals navigate life after college.

The site breaks down some of the most talked-about topics

specific to the 20-something age group: "Homes and Cars," "Money Matters" and "Jobs and Careers."

Sub-categories include "First-time home-buying tips," "Choosing home and auto insurance," "Tips on saving money," "Tax credit claims" and "Risk-free investments." One category addresses starting a business, applying for graduate school, and writing resumes and cover letters.

Bowman maintains the Web site with the help of five freelance writers and columnist Wendy Lalli, who invites readers to ask questions.

"Since it's so new, we're focusing on promoting the Web site and generating traffic with our target audience, said Bowman, who eventually would like to expand the site into campus workshops and public forums.
